From the Principal

North Harford Middle School is very proud of the many advances we have made in the use of technology within the school. By the Fall of 2017, we anticipate that every student will have a school tablet assigned to them for use during the day. There are many educational benefits for having all students use the same technology device. One major advantage is that we control which Apps are on the devices. We do not load social media Apps on the devices and social media sites are blocked from the school devices.

We continue to hear stories from students and parents about inappropriate interactions or cyberbullying on line that occur outside of our controlled network. With our children being Social Media savvy, what can parents do at home to ensure that the Apps that students have on their personal devices are safe and age appropriate?

One of the difficult things about Social Media is that Apps publish terms of use for the ages children must be to be a member of the App. However, most of these sites make this determination based on the Children's Online Privacy Protection Rule (COPPA). This sets the standard age at 13 for what data the sites can collect from users, but does not necessarily restrict the CONTENT of individual posts.

So where can parents turn for more information? I would encourage parents to take a look at <u>www.commonsensemedia.org</u>. This or-

<u>www.commonsensemedia.org</u>. This organization is a non-profit organization dedicated to helping kids thrive in a world of media and technology. They provide a rating system, which makes a recommendation for the appropriate age for students to use individual Apps.

Consider the following popular Apps used by many middle school students on their personal devices when we compare the commonsense media rating to the App terms of use:

While we make no judgement on parental decisions as to which Apps are appropriate for their children, we feel it is important to share as much information as possible to assist parents in making those decisions.

Attention Incoming High School Athletes

The State of Maryland and Harford County Public Schools require all student-athletes to submit a physical prior to starting a season that certifies they are physically fit to participate in any try-out, practice or contest of a school team.

There will be a change in procedure regarding Interscholastic Participation Physicals that will take effect in the upcoming school year 2017-2018.

Beginning in the 2017-2018 school year, we will be requiring physical examination forms for sports to be completed and dated <u>after June 7</u>. Re-authorization of physicals completed before this date will no longer be permitted.



Students entering grades 7 and 8 in school year 2017-2018 must have:

• One Tdap (Tetanus, diphtheria, pertussis booster)

• One Meningitis vaccine (MCV, MCVP4)

Check with your doctor to see if your child has had these vaccinations. Please do not delay; schedule an appointment to receive these vaccines or get documentation of vaccination as soon as possible. Your child will be excluded from school next year if they are not in compliance with these regulations.

One of the programs the NJHS is involved in is morning tutoring. Our members wanted to gain information about how the program was benefiting our school and how we could improve it for next year. We interviewed AM teachers, the students being tutored, and our fellow members to see how people were benefiting from our service.

All of the teachers interviewed said tutoring is a good activity for the NJHS to be involved in. The students feel more comfortable being tutored by other students. Teachers have also noticed that when students have one on one help, there is more improvement. Mrs. Taylor, a 6th grade special education teacher, said that tutoring shows members' knowledge and helps us improve our skills, such as patience and responsibility. The students are understanding the material better too, especially in mathematics. Mrs. Brown, an 8th grade teacher, says that there is sometimes a better connection between students than between student and teacher. Tutoring also bene-

fits the teachers because there are fewer students to run around to. Some criticism for the NJHS members is that we need to improve on not hesitating when helping students. Overall, teachers believe that the tutoring that the NJHS provides is helpful and as the NJHS grows, more students will be helped.

Our peers say that the NJHS image is well-organized and we are great role models for the school. Overall, the members are enjoying tutoring and they think that we are benefiting the student body by helping out with school events and tutoring sixth through eighth graders. Most members also think that some of us are comfortable with tutoring others, but some need to adjust. Although the majority of our members believe that the NJHS is not as well-known as it could be, we will gain momentum in the coming years, as this is only our first year. As NJHS members, we get to meet new people and learn new communication skills. Finally, some members have also noticed an improvement in their work ethic.

One hundred percent of students interviewed feel that the majority of NJHS AM tutors are friendly and encouraging. They also believe that tutoring is helpful in many subjects, such as Math and English. Finally, most students said that they are more comfortable with a fellow student tutoring them than a teacher. However, some students in the AM rooms never had a NJHS tutor or rarely saw one. NJHS members need to make sure that everyone is going to AM so that the students can benefit.

Almost everyone interviewed saw some benefit from tutoring. The teachers as well as students saw grade improvements and the members are learning helpful skills. In summary, the majority of NJHS members are enjoying tutoring and learning new skills that will benefit them forever.
