From the Principal

The Importance of Community

I've had the pleasure of serving as the Principal of North Harford Middle School for 7 years, and as an Assistant Principal for 5 years prior to my appointment as Principal. In that time my best estimate is that I have had the pleasure of being an administrator for well over 5,000 children.

When you have been at a building for that period of time, it becomes impossible to be out and about in the community without running into former students.

The first thing that always happens when I run into them is that it can be a bit depressing to contemplate my own age as I interact with these mature adults who I remember as middle school students. However, once the initial shock of how fast time flies wears off it is always sort of rewarding to see them and hear what they are doing.

In the two weeks prior to school I had my hair cut by a former student, was visiting a family member in a hospital

and met a former student caring for a relative, and saw a news article about a former student working as a scientist. I worked with three teachers who were former students who are now teaching here at NHMS. In recent years I've taken joy in seeing a former student drafted by a Major League Baseball team and seeing another produce a record and send a CD to my office. I've felt proud and thankful for the many former students who have served our community and nation through military service and as EMT's or fire fighters. I am proud to say that I have not yet been pulled over by a former student serving our community as a police officer, but I know you are out there and we are very proud of your service to the community.

What I take away from all of these experiences is a sense

of joy that all of these students have left school with the tools and skills needed to be successful in their lives. Many of the students mentioned started getting ideas of what they wanted to do in their professional lives while they were in middle school. We believe it is our very serious responsibility to offer our students the skills and experiences that will help them pursue whatever dream they may have after graduation. It is my honor to serve the students of our community again this year. I hope it is the best one yet.

ONE WORLD RUN & RUNNING CLUB

PAO's One World Run @ NRC will take place this year at the Norrisville Recreation Complex in White Hall, Maryland. This will be the sixth year to raise money for children in East Africa who have been orphaned by the AIDS crisis. Funding goes directly to the Mission House of Hope which provides food, clothing, health care and education to the children of Kandaria, Kenya. Project AIDS Orphan is a tax exempt pursuant to Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) and most donations are tax deductible. Last year's students of team 7A wrote letters to the community to secure the funding for this year's race. We haven't received donations up to this point, but I feel certain that the 5K will be able to take place as usual. In the words of the late Steve Jobs, "Your time is limited, don't waste it living someone else's life. Don't let the noise of other's opinion drown your own

inner voice. Have the courage to follow your heart and intuition."

PAO's OWR@NRC will take place on **21 November 2015 at the Norrisville Rec Complex**. Packet pick-up for preregistered participants and same-day registration will begin at 8. A stretching and warm-up activity will begin at 8:30 for those interested participants. Registration will close at 8:50 and the race will begin at 9:00 AM, with a kid's fun run to follow at 10:00 AM for the area's younger runners. The race will be timed and awards will be given to the first three finishers in 7 age categories, as well as to the largest youth group involved and overall winner for the male and female divisions. The Falcon Flying Feet Running Club at NHMS won the award for the largest youth group

Dear Parent or Guardian,

New immunization requirements recently enacted will impact your student in school year 2016-2017

- All students entering 7th grade must have had one Tdap vaccination and one meningococcal vaccination.

You should work with your child's doctor to get his/her immunization record documenting these vaccines or receive the required vaccinations if needed. Please bring a copy of your Tdap and meningococcal shot documentation to your school nurse at this time in preparation for the 2016-2017 school year.

These new requirements are in addition to the existing school immunization requirements. According to Maryland School Immunization Regulations (COMAR 10.06.04), to be allowed in school, students must be immunized according to the *Maryland Recommended Childhood Immunization Schedule*. A child has up to 20 days from the start of school to show proof of vaccinations. Your child may not be allowed in school without these vaccinations.

If you have questions about immunizations that are required for school, please call your child's health care provider or the school nurse. If you have recently provided new immunization documentation to your school nurse, kindly disregard this letter.

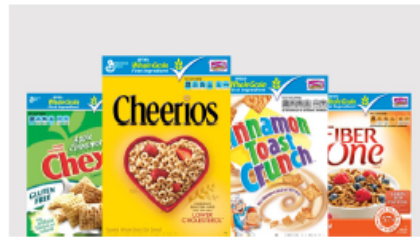

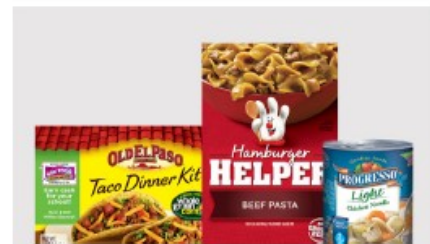
